Ready, Set, Go! – Emergency Evacuation Campaign

The North Fork Fire Department is committed to helping residents prepare for emergencies before they occur. We support the Ready, Set, Go! evacuation program, a nationally recognized public education campaign designed to provide clear, consistent, and easy-to-understand evacuation guidance during emergencies.

Although initially developed for wildfire response, these evacuation levels can be used for any hazard requiring evacuation, including wildfires, floods, hazardous materials incidents, and other emergencies.

READY (Level 1) – Be Ready

A potential threat exists in your area. Stay informed and begin preparing for a possible evacuation.

During a Level 1 – Ready notification, you should:

Monitor local emergency information and weather conditions.

Review your family evacuation plan.

Assemble or update your emergency "Go Kit."

Prepare your home by removing combustible materials near structures and closing windows and doors if wildfire is a concern.

Check on family members and neighbors who may need assistance.

Keep your vehicle fueled and ready to leave if conditions worsen.

Conditions can change rapidly. Do not wait for an official evacuation order if you feel unsafe.

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SET (Level 2) – Be Prepared to Leave

There is a significant threat to your area, and conditions may require evacuation on short notice.

During a Level 2 – Set notification:

Be prepared to leave immediately.

Load your vehicle with your Go Kit, medications, important documents, pets, and other essential items.

People who may require additional time to evacuate, including older adults, individuals with disabilities, families with young children, and those with livestock or large animals—should strongly consider leaving now.

Continue monitoring official updates from local fire, law enforcement, and emergency management agencies.

Leaving early is often the safest option.

GO! (Level 3) – Evacuate Immediately

A Level 3 notification means danger is current or imminent.

Leave Immediately.

Follow evacuation routes provided by emergency officials.

Do not delay gathering additional belongings.

Leave the area as quickly and safely as possible.

Do not return until local authorities have announced that it is safe to do so.

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Your safety and the safety of emergency responders depend on timely evacuation.

Prepare Before an Emergency

Every household should have:

A family emergency communication plan

A designated evacuation route

An emergency Go Kit with supplies for at least 72 hours

Copies of important documents

Prescription medications

Food and water

Pet supplies

Flashlights and extra batteries

Cell phone chargers

Being prepared before an emergency occurs allows you to evacuate quickly and safely while reducing stress during rapidly changing situations.

Remember

Ready – Be aware. Prepare to leave.

Set – Be prepared. Be ready to leave at a moment's notice.

Go! – Leave immediately. Your life may depend on it.
